Implementation of Regional Study Hubs

Dear Colleagues

I am pleased to announce the release of a discussion paper on Implementation of Regional Study Hubs (RSHs) Initiative in response to the Australian Government's \$15.2 million funding commitment over four years to establish up to eight community-owned regional study hubs to improve access to higher education for regional, rural and remote Australia.

As you may be aware, the RSHs Program has been developed in response to the Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport Reference Committee Senate Report on the Future Role and Contribution of Regional Capitals to Australia in late 2016. It addresses a policy gap in university provision for remote students who wish or need to remain in their local regional area for study.

The attached discussion paper provides a high-level overview of the RSHs Program and the department's approach to manage application and stakeholder consultation.
