Conduct targeted transitional activities and workshops with learning coaches and other engagement specialists to offer students the opportunity to become more self- regulated, especially in the first-year experience.

Evaluation

Partnerships and collaboration

Current partnerships with internal and external stakeholders and organisations will be strengthened to widen university participation across disadvantaged communities including local schools, government services, Department of Education and TAFE, community-based and not for profit organisations. And new partnerships will be established with local NGO's, schools, community enterprises and business.

Continue collaboration with GNIBI College of Indigenous Australian Peoples and the Southern Cross University Indigenous Events Coordination Committee (SCUIECC) to identify opportunities for programs tailored for students from low socio-economic and Indigenous Australian backgrounds.
