My daughter spent her prep year at a mainstream school and during that time we watched her love of learning deteriorate to the point where she stopped asking questions and didn't want to have anything explained to her. School for her was a chore and the only part she liked was running to the gate at the end of the day.

Since starting at **Example**, she now loves to learn and share her knowledge. She is inquisitive and curious about the world around her. Her interaction with nature and other areas such as music, craft and cooking has made her realise that learning has many facets. She wants to read and enjoys maths now as well.

Interacting with children in a multi-age environment has also made her kinder, more considerate and allows her to both learn and share what she has learned, so she doesn't constantly feel like a person who is being "told" or taught something – she has intrinsic value.

We are very happy at and are SO grateful that this option for schooling exists.
