## Additional Comments

For those of us who teach/lead in remote areas, we are told, you chose to live there, deal with it. Lacks in IT and support, maintenance support hard to get and is always higher due to travel, DCP providing no support only red tape.

You only have to work in the Aboriginal lands and in areas where there are large populations of Aborigines to see that the DCP allow children to be exposed to neglect, sexualized behavior, drug and alcohol abuse, violence and trauma. This is acceptable behavior in there eyes. No matter how many reports you put in nothing is done. If this behavior occurred in a middle or upper class family they come down hard (have seen); they have caught the white whale. Plenty of media coverage and attention. Yet, Aboriginal children don't deserve this right in the DCP's eyes. They are so committed to keeping them with family that they will allow these atrocities to continue. The Stolen Generation was one of Australia's worst mistakes. Now the children of today suffer.
